CORNING'S GLASSBARGE 2018 IS COMING TO MIDDLEPORT

The Corning Museum of Glass (CMoG) GlassBarge is stopping in Middleport in August!!!! This is a fully-equipped, glassblowing demonstration studio built on a 30' x 90' steel barge. The GlassBarge is a one-of-a-kind floating venue for the Museum's signature Hot Glass Show, a, live, narrated glassblowing demonstration.

Hot glass demonstrations will be offered free to the public throughout the day while the *GlassBarge* is in port. Up to 150 guests can be accommodated onboard for each 30-40-minute performance.

Seating is limited, so guests are strongly encouraged to register online as soon as possible (https://www.eventbrite.com/d/ny--corning/glassbarge/). If you don't use the internet, stop at the library or the Village Hall for help getting registered.

Registration will be available four to six weeks prior to each stop. The GlassBarge will arrive in Middleport the evening of Aug. 7, docking behind the Village Hall. It will be open on Weds., Aug. 8 for tours from 11 am to 6 pm.

The Lois McClure will also return to Middleport as it accompanies the GlassBarge on its tour of the Historic Erie Barge Canal. Self-guided tours of this schooner replica will also be offered on Weds., Aug. 8 only from 11 am to 6 pm.

The RH Community Library will have a special event that ties into this visit. Watch for information!

The GlassBarge and the Lois McClure will leave early Thurs. Aug. 9.

FROM THE BUILDING & CODE OFFICE.....

New York State regulations have changed in the recent past, and some folks aren't aware of those changes.

Building permits are now required when a pool is installed, when siding is installed or replaced, and when your roof is replaced. Middleport enforces state, county, and local laws and codes when

applicable.

BACKYARD FIRES

Mr. Belson would also like to remind residents that within the Village limits the size of recreational fires permitted is 3 feet in diameter and flames no higher than 4 feet.

Enjoy your backyard, but please keep yourself and your neighbors safe by obeying open fire laws.

The NYS DEC puts a residential burn ban in place every year from mid-March to mid-May. Trees, bushes, and grass are very dry & fire can spread quickly.

QUARTERLY WATER/SEWER BILLINGS are mailed out Feb 1, May 1, Aug 1, and Nov 1 each year. If you don't receive yours, contact the Clerk's Office for a duplicate. A 10% penalty is added if unpaid 30 days from bill date. An additional 10% penalty is added if unpaid 60 days from bill date. Water service may be shut off after 60 days unpaid.

WHAT TO DO WITH YARD WASTE

The Village of Middleport Public Works Department reminds Village residents of its yard waste pickup policies:

BRUSH: will be chipped each Monday except for the months of January, February and March. Brush is to be placed at the curb on Sunday evenings, butt end toward the street, stacked no more than 4 feet high. Please do not place roots, stumps,

vines or rose bushes out for chipping. Failure to follow this advice can cause all of the brush to be left at the curb. Continually leaving brush at the curb too early can be cause for citation of the Village's yard maintenance law. When tree or lawn work is performed by a private contractor, they should take away the debris.

WOOD CHIPS: Wood chips are available for Village residents' yard use. Please call Bryan Bobbitt at 735-3303 for arrangements.

LEAVES: in the fall, leaves are to be raked to the edge of the street and left in open piles. Any other time they are to be bagged and placed out with garbage.

MIDDLEPORT SUMMER RECREATION PROGRAM

DISABLED PARKING

Has your disabled parking hang tag expired or do you need one? The Clerk's Office issues them to Village residents. Paperwork is available to take to your doctor for a temporary or permanent hang tag. Contact the Clerk's office for more information.

REFUSE & RECYCLING REMINDERS

The Clerk's Office regularly gets calls regarding "large item pick up days."

Through the contract with Modern Disposal for refuse & recycling pickup, large items may be put to the curb weekly.

One large item a week is allowed. Any item that can be easily picked up by two people may be put to the curb for weekly refuse pickup. If an item is larger than that, it is the resident's responsibility to arrange for disposal of the item.

With biweekly recycling pickup, it's sometimes confusing to remember which week to put the recycling out.

Recycling schedules are available throughout the year, either at the Clerk's Office (24 Main Street) or by downloading it from the Village's website

www.villageofmiddleport.org.

Please note that a total of six (6) items only may be placed to the curb for pickup, including a large item, garbage

cans or bags, and your recycling cart. The large green carts are for recycling only.

Refuse/recycling should be at the curb between 6:30 pm the night before pickup and 6:30 am the morning of pickup. Drivers change all the time, so don't rely on "they usually are here by...."to get your trash out.

If your address gets missed, please call the Clerk's office to report it. After hours, leave a message.

PUBLICITY NEEDED?
