NOTES FROM OUR DPW

Brush – As a reminder BRUSH is to be placed at the curb with the butt end toward the street and stacked no more than 4 feet high. Please DO NOT place roots, stumps, vines or rose bushes out for chipping as this may result in all of your brush not getting picked up. Brush chipping is every Monday and runs from April thru November, weather permitting.

Under **NO** circumstances should yard waste be thrown into the street or ditches. This can cause ditch or storm drain blockage which in turn can cause flooding. The **ONLY** exception to this is leaf pickup in the **fall**.

Leaves – Leaves are ONLY picked up in the *fall*. They are to be raked to the edge of the grass in the street and left in open piles. Leaf pickup will start once the leaves really start accumulating on the ground, and will end around November 30, 2023, weather permitting.

LASTLY, Coordinator Bobbitt would like to REMIND EVERYONE NOT to flush feminine hygiene products and "flushable" wipes. It is a MAJOR problem within the Village. This causes sewer mainlines to back up so PLEASE be considerate of your neighbors and the Village sewer system.

From the Mayor's desk

I would like to take this opportunity to recognize two members of the Middleport Police Department. Sgt Roland Johnson and Officer Joshua Mandaville. Sgt Johnson was honored at the Niagara County Judges and Police Awards Banquet in April 2023 for a house fire he responded to in June 2022. Sgt Johnson arrived first on the scene and using a ladder he assisted a male out of the second-floor window and safely to the ground.

Officer Mandaville was recognized by the Niagara County Committee of the American Legion in April 2023. The Gasport American Legion submitted Officer Mandaville for this distinction for a call he responded to in April 2022 at the Royalton Hartland Elementary School where he was the first on the scene to assist a male that had fallen and was not breathing. Officer Mandaville checked for a pulse and immediately began CPR while directing someone to open the police department's AED unit in preparation to shock if necessary. The Gasport Fire Rescue arrived and connected their AED unit which indicated a shock was needed. Officer Mandaville started CPR again after the shock was given. After he was stable the gentleman was transported safely to the hospital.

Please join me in congratulating Sgt Johnson and Officer Mandaville. The Village of Middleport is grateful for your dedicated service to the community.

<u>Water/Sewer Rate Increase</u>

The Village Board of Trustees voted in January 2023 to increase the Village's water and sewer rates. There has not been a rate increase since 2018. The Village purchases their water from Niagara County, and the county raised their rates in January. The costs of operating the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) have also increased since the NYS Dept of Environmental Conservation places strict standards for the operation of WWTP that the Village must adhere to. This is why two capital projects were recently completed in order to be in compliance with their mandates. This year we have begun the Capacity, Management, Operation, and Maintenance program (CMOM) which is an additional requirement for the operation of the WWTP.

REMINDER...

There is a drop box for all unused prescriptions, OTC medications, and dietary supplements in the Police Department. Please stop by the Village Clerk's office for assistance in disposing of these items during office hours.

INFORMATION FROM CODE ENFORCEMENT

Middleport Code 97-4: A Building Permits Required Installation of a solid-fuel-burning heating appliance, chimney, or flue in any dwelling unit.

NO Person shall commence any work for which a Building Permit is required without first having obtained a Building Permit from the Code Enforcement Officer.

NYSDEC: Open burning is permitted for small recreational fires including small cooking and campfires. Burning of waste products or garbage is *prohibited*, including newspaper, paper products, plastic, chemically treated wood (pressure treated) and plywood.

Complaints call NYSDEC @ 1-877-457-5680 (24 hours)

Premise Identification: New and existing buildings shall have approved address numbers, building numbers or approved building identification plainly legible and visible from the street. Numbers shall be a *minimum* of 4 inches.

Fire Code of NYS §507.5.5: A 3-foot clear space shall be maintained around the circumference of fire hydrants. Please keep snow and other obstructions away from hydrants.
